Program Note

During this Christmas season most people worldwide are experiencing lockdown, and won't be gathering with family or friends, but will be reimagining Christmas celebrations. i Coristi Chamber Choir offers "A Christmas Visit" as an option for some of those revised plans, and hopes that it can be a gift of hope and joy this Christmas. That said, this concert has a greater purpose and mission.

When i Coristi's Director, Dr. Rob Curtis, shared his vision for "A Christmas Visit" in August of 2020, at that time one of the tragedies of the COVID-19 pandemic was that many seniors had been largely cut off from the rest of the community and were experiencing elevated levels of isolation; sadly this reality continues to this day. Rob had a vision to respond to that isolation, and to share some Christmas cheer by taking advantage of the technology that many facilities had obtained for remote family visits. As part of that mission, i Coristi has intentionally reached out to Edmonton area organizations that serve the elder population, to share this music widely. We invite you to extend that mission, to reach out to someone who is experiencing loneliness, and to share "A Christmas Visit" with them. Thank you for tuning in to "A Christmas Visit". May it be a sign of how we get through this pandemic together.

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
